Life Cycle	Perennial
Family	Ranunculaceae
Origin	Eastern North America
Special Features	Light yellow nodding lanterns. Gently self-sows and is more long-lived than many columbine species. Excellent choide for containers. Has thick roots.
Historical	Chance seedling found by nurseryman, Richard Simon, of Bluemount Nurseries, near the town of Corbett, Maryland (USA).

Cultivation

Grams per 1000 seeds	0.43478 Gram
Seeds per Gram	2300 (does not correspond to the number of plants!)



Gram to get 1000 plants	3 Gram (if sown directly into pots etc. you will need a larger quantity)
Sowing Rates/Trays	5 per cell
Plug tray recommended size(s)	72
Sowing Direction	(15) Rapidly germinating, keep seed in constant moisture (not wet) with temperatures of about +20°C [68°F]. Seeds must be covered thinly. Do not cover very small seeds, but tightly press into the earth. Keep in cooler conditions after germination occurs.

Scheduling

Best Sowing Date	late autumn - early spring (northern Hemisphere, Field condition)
Sowing to Germination	6 - 8 weeks
Germination to Transplant	4 - 6 weeks
Transplanting to Potting	6 - 8 weeks

Container Size(s)	1 plug per 8/9 cm (3 1/2") / 1-2 plugs per 11/12 cm (4 1/2")
Fertilizer	Medium (150-200 ppm)
