Life Cycle	Perennial
Family	Hyacinthaceae
Origin	Western North America: prairie, mountain meadows, banks.
Distinction	Award of Garden Merit (A.G.M.) from the Royal Horticultural Society.
Special Features	Mostly skyblue star-shaped flowerumbels. Tolerates more moisture in the substrate than most other bulbous plants. Suitable for natural landscaping. Deer resistant.
Historical	Named after the botanist and breeder Max Leichtlin (1831-1910), Baden-Baden (Germany).

Flower Colour	mostly blue
Natural Flowering Period	May - June
Winter Hardiness Zones	Z3 - Z7
Foliage	Entire, linear, pointed, green.

Sowing Direction

(8) These perennial seeds germinate very irregularly over a long period. Lower temperatures of less than +5°C [41°F] are very effective. Seed trays should not be discarded prematurely. Constant moisture must be maintained. Do not leave in direct sunlight. For Alstroemeria we recommend to keep sowing for 3 weeks at approximately +30°C [86°F], then 3 weeks at +5°C [41°F], then at +21°C [70°F].
